

The studios kabako

The Studios Kabako organization is dedicated to the development of dance and visual theatre in Kinshasa.

It aims both at addressing artistic and aesthetic issues and at fostering professional and structural skills through research, creation and circulation. It also provides training opportunities for artists as well as for management and technical staff. We don't want to focus on a personal creative approach, but very well to encourage, through on-going training programmes, independent thought and personal initiative among dancers, allowing them to exchange with other artists and to circulate abroad (North-South, South-South). An approach deeply anchored in DRC political, social and economic context, but also very open to the world. This is essential for a country that suffered years of isolation and confinement, leading a whole population to a monolithic thinking system.

With support from local and international partners, the Studios Kabako has presented over the past 18 months four dance works, "Spectacularly Empty" (2001), "Triptyque Sans Titre" (2002) and "Spectacularly Empty II" (2003), three works by Faustin Linyekula and "Le Sentier" (2003) by Madrice Imbujo Itoko. It has also conducted various projects in collaboration with the following artists:

- ▲▼ Dancer Cécile BACQUÉ, from France, in September-October 2001 and in February 2004;
- ▲▼ Choreographer Toufik OUDHRIRI IDRISSI (Morroco-France) and dancer Hanna HEDMAN (Ethiopia-Sweden) in August 2002;
- ▲▼ Hip-hop dancer Anne Nguyen (France) in January 2004...

▲▼ French choreographer Sylvain Prunenec and the Adugna Company from Ethiopia as part of the Kin-Addis programme to take place in Kinshasa and Addis Ababa in August and November 2004...

Partnership has also been established with different institutions including the Ecole Nationale Supérieure des Arts Décoratifs (Strasbourg, France) where Faustin Linyekula is regularly conducting workshops and the Collectif 12 (Mantes-La-Jolie, France).

Contacts are also being made with the KAAY FECC dance festival (Senegal), the Kenyan-based GAARA Dance Company and the Egyptian theatre company El Warsha.

faustin linyekula

Dancer and choreographer, Faustin lives and works in Kinshasa (Democratic Republic of Congo, former Zaire, former Belgian Congo, former independent state of Congo...).

Following literature and theatre studies in Kisangani, he settles in Nairobi in 1993 and collaborates with mime artist Opiyo Okach and dancer Afrah Tenambergen, co-founding in 1997 the first contemporary dance company in Kenya, the Gàara company.

Their first piece, *Cleansin*g receives an award at the Rencontres chorégraphiques africaines de Luanda in 1998, and is then performed at the Montpellier Dance Festival (France) and at the Filature in Mulhouse (France) among others.

Since, Faustin has been working as a choreographer, performer and dance teacher between South Africa, Reunion Island and Europe. He was offered residencies by Régine Chopinot in La Rochelle (France), Mathilde Monnier in Montpellier (France) and the Tanzwochen Festival in Wien (Austria) where he created with South-African dancer Gregory Maqoma "Tales off the Mud Wall" (2000).

Back in Kinshasa since June 2001, he has developped a centre dedicated to dance and visual theatre, providing training programmes, as well as supporting research and creation: the Studios Kabako. With the Studio, Faustin has presented three pieces: "Spectacularly empty" (2001) premiered in Kinshasa and in Yaounde, "Triptyque sans titre" (2002) premiered in Kinshasa and recently presented in France, Belgium, Germany and Central Africa and "Spectacularly empty II", a revival for the black box of the 2001 piece, performed in Kinshasa and in Paris last October.

Faustin Linyekula was also recently commissionned by the Suresnes Jean-Vilar Theatre to create a piece for hip-hop dancers, "Telle une ombre gravée dans la poussière", performed in January as part of the Festival Suresnes Cités Danse.

In January 2004, he presented in Paris a solo piece for French dancer Sylvain Prunenec as part of the 2003 Avignon Festival, "Si c'est un nègre / autoportrait".
